

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS

**AIR TRANSPORTATION:** ARC/IATAN jet economy class, round trip from gateway city applicable on all IATAN and ARC carriers, based on the non-refundable fare. Tours must be fully paid for and tickets issued no later than 60 days before the tour's departure date. If you cancel or change your reservation for any reason after tickets have been issued, a cancellation fee of 100% of the ticket price will be charged by the airline. Fuel Surcharges: We will review the air costs approximately 65 days before departure and notify you of any changes in air fuel surcharges or taxes. Deviations: Deviation requests should be in writing and will incur an additional service fee plus any applicable fare increases.

**LAND TRANSPORTATION AND TRANSFERS:** By private deluxe motor coach.

**ACCOMMODATIONS:** Tour prices are per person, based on two persons sharing double or twin-bedded rooms with private bathroom with tub or shower. Single rooms subject to availability and an additional cost of \$1,170 (tour participants without a roommate will have to pay the single room surcharge). Hotels used are Superior First class category.

**MEALS:** Breakfast and dinner daily. Coffee or tea included with breakfast only; all other beverages are extra.

**BAGGAGE:** Subject to change, free baggage allowance is governed by the airline on which you are flying. Baggage allowance guidelines will be included in your final documents. Excess baggage will be charged at the established rates. Due to limited motor coach capacity we urge our tour members to carry only one bag per person. Porterage for one checked bag is included in the tour price. Excess baggage charges from the airlines and motor coaches are the passenger's responsibility and will be collected at time of handling.

**SERVICE CHARGES AND TAXES:** Those normally levied by hotels and restaurants are included and all departure taxes and tipping.

**NOT INCLUDED:** Passport costs, and health documentation costs (when required); food and beverages (including coffee and tea) not usually included with regular table d'hote meals; optional sightseeing tours and excursions; accident, baggage and trip cancellation insurance; transporting and handling excess luggage; tips to persons rendering special services not specifically mentioned as included; items of a purely personal nature such as laundry, telephone and cable expenses, internet access, room service orders, etc.; transportation between hometown city and gateway city.

**INSURANCE:** Acting only as agents for suppliers, Wilcox World Travel and Tours, Div. of Wilcox Travel Agency, Inc., is not responsible for damage, loss, or theft of luggage and/or personal belongings, or for personal injury, accident and/or illness. For protection, it is important that you have adequate insurance to cover these possibilities. We recommend Allianz Travel Insurance. Travel protection is available to all residents of the U.S. and Canada, and includes cancellation protection, coverage for lost luggage, medical emergencies and more. Guests booking this tour have the option of purchasing and may request at time of booking. Fee must be included with initial payment. Details will be provided with written confirmation of your tour reservation. Please note: Israel will require all tourists to have travel insurance that includes coverage for lockdown, isolation quarantine, and hospitalization as a result of Covid.

**IMPORTANT PASSPORT INFORMATION:** A valid passport is required and must be obtained in person by each tour member at a local passport office. Passports must have an expiration date beyond August 12, 2022 in order to travel with this tour. If your expiration date is inside this date, you must renew your passport in order to participate.

**VISA:** A visa is not required for US citizens traveling to Israel.

**DEPOSITS AND PAYMENTS:** A non-refundable deposit of \$500.00 per person is required immediately. Installment payments are accepted and updated statements will be forwarded with each payment sent. The balance is due no later than 60 days prior to departure. Please check your statement for specific due dates. Tour conditions and airfares are subject to Governmental, ARC/IATAN, and airline regulation requirements in effect on the date of and during the tour. All airfares and land rates are quoted in US Dollars and are based on tariffs and cost in effect March, 2021 and are subject to change without notice. Land costs are based on group rates and final tour cost may be dependent on number of tour participants.

**GUESTS WITH DISABILITIES:** Please be aware that certain land tours may not be fully accessible to persons with disabilities. Wilcox World Travel and Tours must be notified of any special medical, physical or other requirements of passengers at the time of booking. Should a passenger require the assistance of another to make this tour, it is the responsibility of that passenger to arrange for a companion to provide the assistance at all times and for the entire duration of the tour.

**PARTICIPATING AIR CARRIERS:** The services of any ARC/IATAN air carrier may be used by Wilcox World Travel and Tours, Div. of Wilcox Travel Agency, Inc. for the air portion of these tours.

Thus, by accepting the coupons and tickets and utilizing the services, you agree that neither Wilcox World Travel and Tours nor any of its Tour Hosts or Representatives shall be liable for any loss, injury or damage to you or your belongings or otherwise in connection with any accommodations, transportation or other services, or resulting directly or indirectly from any occurrences beyond its control including breakdown in equipment, strikes, theft, delay or cancellation of or changes in itinerary, or schedules, etc. Also, remember that travel documents are your responsibility as well as compliance with custom regulations. **CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS:** If a passenger cancels his/her tour membership up to 61 days prior to departure, there will be a cancellation fee of \$500.00 to cover administration and communication costs. For cancellations within 60-46 days of departure date you will be subject to a 50% penalty or \$500.00 whichever is greater. Cancellations within 45 days are subject to a penalty of 100% of tour price. All cancellation requests must be addressed to Wilcox Travel in writing. Trip cancellation insurance is strongly recommended.

## DAY BY DAY ITINERARY

### DAY 01 – WED. FEB. 02 - OVERNIGHT FLIGHT

Depart Cleveland for an overnight international flight to Tel Aviv, with a connection in Newark.

### DAY 02 – THU. FEB. 03 - ARRIVE / THE SHARON PLAIN AND GALILEE

We arrive at Tel Aviv's Ben Gurion Airport this morning where we are met by our Wilcox Tours' agent. After passport control and baggage claim we will meet our guide, board our bus and drive through the Valley of Sharon North to Caesarea by the Sea. We begin where the baptism of Gentiles began, at Caesarea Maritima (Acts 10). We will include the sunken harbor, the hippodrome, the theatre and the Roman aqueduct. We then drive to Muhraka (“burnt offering”) on Mt. Carmel, with a panoramic view of the Plain of Jezreel. Then we cross the country to the Arbel cliff for a magnificent view over the Sea of Galilee and the sites of Jesus' mission. Three nights at our hotel overlooking the historic Sea of Galilee.

### DAY 03 – FRI. FEB. 04- SEA OF GALILEE



After breakfast, we will drive up the Golan Heights for a panoramic view of the lake from the East. We'll cross to the Mount of Beatitudes (Matthew 5-7). Those who wish may walk down the hill to the lake, meeting the group at Tabgha, where Christians have long remembered the

first feeding of the multitude (Mark 6). We'll make a stop at Kursi, where early Christians remembered Jesus' casting demons into a herd of swine. We then go on to Cana, commemorating Jesus' transformation of water into wine. In Nazareth we'll visit the site of the ancient village and the “Church of Mary's Well.” We continue to Megiddo for the site of biblical

Armageddon (Revelation 16). We end the day with a visit to the modern baptismal site at the point where the Jordan flows out of the lake. If you wish to be baptized or reaffirm your faith again by baptism, plan to join this ceremony. We will return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

### DAY 04 – SAT. FEB. 05 - UPPER GALILEE / TIBERIAS

After breakfast, we begin our day with a refreshing boat ride on the Sea of Galilee in a boat modeled on one from Jesus' time. Afterwards, we'll have the opportunity to see the “Jesus Boat” in the Yigal Allon Museum at Kibbutz Ginosar, one of several communal farms in Israel. We continue on to Capernaum, where



Franciscan archaeologists believe they have uncovered the house of Peter (Mark 1 and 2). Bethsaida Archaeological Park has been under excavation since 1987, and is now open to pilgrims from around the world! After our St. Peter fish lunch, we travel to Hazor, the largest Canaanite city, for a brief visit and a view of Mount Hermon and its beautiful surroundings. We continue to Dan, where we combine a nature walk beside the Upper Jordan with views of the ancient ruins, including the Israelite high place that supported a golden calf (I Kings 12). A short drive then takes us to the spring of Caesarea Philippi (Baniyas) where Peter confessed his recognition of Jesus as Christ (Matthew 16). Here we can visit the stunning remains of a first-century AD palace belonging to Agrippa II. We then drive around Mt. Hermon for a glimpse of Damascus, 45 miles away, before heading back over the Golan Heights to our home on the Sea of Galilee for dinner and overnight.

### DAY 05 – SUN. FEB. 06 – BETH SHEAN / JERICHO / JERUSALEM

Today we'll cross the plain and descend through the Jezreel Valley to Beth Shean (aka Scythopolis). Here we shall climb the tel and view the setting for the death of Saul (I Samuel 28 - II Samuel 1). We will then survey the magnificent Roman and Byzantine ruins: theatre, bathhouses, ancient rest rooms, market areas, colonnaded streets. Journey further

south to the oldest city in the world, Jericho, settled in 9,000 BC. It is also the lowest, at 820' below sea level. View the Mt. of Temptation where Jesus was led into the wilderness and tempted by the devil, after His baptism. Ascending the Roman road along Wadi Qelt, we stop for a look at St. George's Monastery. Finally, atop Mt. Scopus, we behold majestic Jerusalem! We'll have dinner and the next four overnights in Jerusalem.

### DAY 06 – MON. FEB. 07 - JERUSALEM / BETHLEHEM / JERUSALEM

On the Mount of Olives (smile for your group photo) we visit the Church of Ascension, Tomb of the Virgin Mary, Garden of Gethsemane, and the Church of All Nations. In Mt. Zion we visit the Coenaculum - Room of the Last Supper, and Tomb of David; the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu, where Peter denied Christ; three times before the cock crowed. In the Valley of Kidron we will see the Pool of Siloam where Jesus healed a blind man. Enjoy a breathtaking panorama of old and new Jerusalem. Ephrath - meaning fertility, is now known as Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus. In the Church of the Nativity we see a stone manger, where it is believed Jesus was born. We'll have time for shopping and souvenirs here in Bethlehem. On our return to Jerusalem we'll drive past the Shepherd's Field, where the angels announced the birth of Christ.

### DAY 07 – TUE. FEB. 08 - THE RIFT VALLEY

Early this morning we drive through Ein Gedi to visit the fortress Masada, rising 1,200 feet above the desert plain. This mountaintop fortress is where the Jews committed mass-suicide rather than be taken captive by the Romans. See the restoration efforts of remains of buildings dating



back to the fourth and fifth centuries AD. Afterward, those who wish may enjoy a “float” in the Dead Sea. View Qumran where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found by a Bedouin shepherd in 1948, before visiting the Shrine of the Book, displaying the scroll of Isaiah.

### DAY 08 – WED. FEB. 09 - THE ARCHAEOLOGY OF JERUSALEM

Deep in the heart of Jerusalem we tour the Western Wall Tunnel (also known as “the rabbis tunnel”) and see the Dome of the Rock Mosque, next to the Wailing Wall. Our walking tour in the Old City of Jerusalem will begin by the Lion's Gate, at the Church of St.



Anne, and the Pool of Bethesda, where Jesus said to the man “Take up thy bed and walk.” Along the Via Dolorosa - “Sorrowful Road,” we see the stations connected with the crucifixion of Jesus. The Church of the Holy Sepulchre represents the final station where He was crucified. On the Mount of Olives we visit the Paternoster Church, where the Lord's Prayer is written in 35 languages (the site where Jesus taught his disciples the Lord's Prayer).

### DAY 09 – THU. FEB. 10 - JERUSALEM / TEL AVIV AIRPORT

Our final day in Jerusalem we have a leisurely morning before checking out of our hotel. The Holyland Model affords us the opportunity to envision what Jerusalem might have looked like during the reign of King Herod. This magnificent work of art is continually being updated as new archaeological discoveries are being made. We visit Yad VaShem, the Holocaust Memorial Museum, dedicated to the six million Jews who lost their lives before and during the World War II. Also, memorials have been placed to the many Gentiles who helped the Jews during this period, risking their lives to do so. This afternoon, a special service and communion will be held at the Garden Tomb. This evening we'll enjoy a Middle Eastern farewell dinner at the Ambassador Hotel in Jerusalem, before we drive to the airport for our late evening check in for our flight home.

### DAY 10 – FRI. FEB. 11 - ARRIVE U.S.A.

Today we arrive back in the USA on our flight from Tel Aviv.
